- Fixed timescales and resource budgets
- Software development techniques that significantly reduce errors

Certificate Exams

There are two exams included with the AgilePM course. Both exams are set and marked by APMG.

The Foundation exam is held at the end of Day 3: Multiple choice format; 50 questions per paper; 25 marks out of 50 required to pass (50%); 40 minutes duration; closed-book

The Practitioner exam is held at the end of Day 4: Objective testing; 4 questions per paper; 20 marks available per question; 40 marks out of 80 required to pass (50%); 2.5 hours duration; open book (restricted to the manual only).

Pre-Requisites

There are no pre-requisites to sit the Foundation exam. To be eligible to take the Practitioner exam you must have one of the following: AgilePM Foundation Certificate, or DSDM Atern Foundation Certificate, or DSDM Advanced Practitioner Certificate.
